## WHAT IS CO-OP?

Better than internships, co-ops are semesters of **paid, full-time work in your field**. On average students earn **\$40,000** total through co-op experiences. UC students receive guidance on resumes and interviews, and have access to a database of hundreds of employers to work for. Engineering, IT, Design, Business, and Communication all offer co-op experiences.

## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

1-2 letters of recommendation  
Essay (topics available online)  
Personal statement

### HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS

- Send official transcripts showing the current year's subjects and the previous 3 years' subjects.
- You can request that a high school official upload the transcripts via the Common Application, OR you can submit the official or notarized, sealed transcripts through the physical mail.
- Transcripts should include a certified English translation, if needed.

### PROOF OF ENGLISH ABILITY

UC uses the following tests for Proof of English Ability:

- SAT-I
- ACT
- Cambridge
- ELS Certificate
- IELTS
- TOEFL
- PTE
- Duolingo (DET)

### PROOF OF MATH ABILITY

The Proof of Math Ability requirement may be satisfied by submitting scores from any of the following exams:

- SAT-I
- ACT
- UC Math Placement Test

## TUITION RATES (2020-21)

Full-time tuition rates for UC Main Campus

Tuition and other fees: **\$28,972**

Living Expenses: **\$14,958\***

*\*This includes: Housing, Telephone, Food, Books & Class Fees, Commuting, other typical expenses*

Health insurance (required): **\$2,360**

Total: **\$46,290**

During co-op semesters, undergraduate students only pay a \$465 fee instead of normal tuition rates.

## SCHOLARSHIPS

UC international scholarships award between \$1,000 and \$26,000 per year to qualified students, with an average award of **\$10,000**. While test scores and GPA are considered, all aspects of an application are used to determine amounts. No extra application is necessary to be considered!

  - Priority consideration to our more competitive programs and top scholarship considerations
- March 1 - Rolling
  - Means that we accept applications on a space-available basis
